1 Pursuant to the settlement reached on October 30, 2008 by and between
2 Plaintiff (“Plaintiff”) on the one hand and Defendants County of San Bernardino
3 and Gary Penrod (“Defendants”) on the other hand, the general terms of which
4 are memorialized in the Settlement Agreement, all claims by Plaintiff against all
5 Defendants are hereby dismissed, with prejudice. It is the obligation of the
6 parties requesting dismissal to comply with the terms of the Settlement
7 Agreement.


8 The United States District Court for the Central District of California,
9 Judge Virginia A. Phillips, specifically retains jurisdiction over this case for a
10 term of three years to enforce the Settlement Agreement forming the
11 underpinning of this dismissal, with the condition that no party may seek to
12 enforce the settlement without first providing the other side notice of any alleged
13 violation and a reasonable opportunity to cure the alleged violation and without
14 meeting and conferring in good faith.

15 The Complaint is hereby dismissed with prejudice, subject to the terms of
16 the Settlement Agreement, attached to the Request for Dismissal of Case as
17 Exhibit 1 and incorporated into the record herein.
