

STATEMENT OF POLICY FOR  
INTEGRATION OF STAFF AND STUDENT POPULATION  
AT THE GILCHRIST COUNTY TRAINING SCHOOL  
TRENTON, FLORIDA

AUGUST 4, 1970

The Gilchrist County Training School is a 169 bed, coeducational facility operated under the auspices of the Division of Youth Services which will begin accepting students during the latter part of 1970 or the early part of 1971. The policy in relation to staff will be that we will recruit, hire and promote the best qualified individuals regardless of color. Equal Opportunity Employment is the present policy of the Division of Youth Services and will be the policy at the Gilchrist School. Our advertising, which is handled through the Florida State Employment Service, will state that we are an Equal Opportunity Employer. We will recruit from all students in the appropriate subject matter areas in the major educational institutions in Florida. Where possible, we will follow a policy of promoting from within the Division. When a promotion becomes available, it will be advertised to all employees of the Division. All persons qualified under the Division of Personnel and Retirement standards will be encouraged to apply. The best applicant will be promoted, regardless of race. We will not follow a quota system in employment or promotion policy.

Our student population will be housed in the nine cottages on campus. The student population will be segregated according to sex: four of the cottages for female students and five of the cottages will be for male students. Within the male and female clusters, students will be placed in individual cottages by age, level of functioning, emotional maturity, and aggressiveness. Racially the cottages will be maintained as closely as possible to the percentage of the overall cluster population. In other words, if the overall percentage of the male population is 60% black students and 40% white students, every effort will be made to maintain a like percentage in each of the individual cottages. The same policy will be followed with the female cluster.
