

WHAT IS YOUR PLAN FOR THE DESEGREGATION OF THE LOS ANGELES CITY SCHOOLS?

On Wednesday, July 6th, the Los Angeles City Board of Education received a "Minute Order" issued by the Superior Court. Included in the order was the Court's opinion of the pupil integration plan proposal approved March 3, 1977 by the Board of Education.

The Court also ruled that the Board of Education must return to the Court within 90 days with a plan or plans to "realistically commence the desegregation of the district not later than February, 1978." Therefore, the Board of Education is accepting from groups and/or individuals completed, reasonable alternative plans for consideration. Determination of reasonableness of plans submitted will include consideration of factors relative to cost, feasibility and potential for providing successful integrated educational opportunities for pupils.
